At the annual meeting of Churt Parish Council on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> May, I, Councillor David Crossley was re-elected as chairman and Councillor Kevin Lower was re-elected as vice chairman. I was saddened, however to receive the resignation of Councillor David Gay who has decided to stand down after some 5 years' service to the council. During his time as a councillor David has been a member of both the Planning Committee and Recreation Ground Committee of which he was chairman for 4 years. You may have noticed that the village website has been modernised. Police are also warning of telephone crime. Please beware of any unsolicited telephone calls offering ways of making easy money. There are various "scams" doing the rounds at present. Please do not be taken in and Police advice is that if you are in any doubt just hang up on cold callers. A bank or building society will never ask for your account details.

Spring is now well and truly here and before we know it, it will be summer. Hedges tend to start growing very quickly. Could I please ask you to keep an eye on any of yours which adjoin footpaths and could obstruct them.

A few weeks ago some appallingly horrible and obscene graffiti appeared on the back wall of the pavilion on the recreation ground and to a lesser extent on one of the walls of Churt Club. This has been removed at a cost of several hundred pounds. The matter has been reported to police and is under investigation. It is regrettable that such behaviour should occur anywhere, let alone our lovely village. Maybe the only deterrent is installation of a CCTV system, something the Parish Council is seriously considering.
