Christmas 2020

This will be like no other Christmas, with Covid restrictions in place. We have travelled a long journey over the past nine months and the end could be in sight with vaccinations starting. We must not, however, lower our guard and become complacent. There is an opportunity to visit family and friends over the Christmas period from 23rd to 27th December. Please remember that we are still on high alert and in Tier 2 (although the remainder of Surrey as of Saturday 19th December will move to tier 3), so please remain extra vigilant and as the Prime Minister and others have advised, please do not regard the Christmas relaxation as a "must do" but rather a "can do" with sensible precautions taken.

At 4pm on Christmas Eve there will be a short outdoor service on the green in front of St John's Church with the floodlit church as the backdrop. Carols will be sung together with a number of Christmas readings. Parking will be very restricted so please try and park elsewhere.

Churt Community Support Group

The Churt community rose magnificently to the challenge of the Covid pandemic and what a response that was with the formation of the Churt Covid Community Support Group. I, the clerk and councillors would like to sincerely thank all those involved in the group. It is apparent that the wish is that the group should continue even when this crisis is over and so it shall. It is now known as the Churt Community Support Group.

It does not replace Waverley Social Services or other established village organisations. The phone line, manned by a small team of duty officers, is open to take calls Mondays to Fridays only between 10am and 6pm. Please leave a message and a member of our team will get back to you as soon as possible, but always within 24 hours, to discuss your request and how it will be met.

Crime and Security

Incidents of crime reported to the Police in Churt are still very low. Please, however, take all precautions and please do not forget to report all incidences of crime to the police. As previously stated, your information could just be the final small piece in a much larger jigsaw. Stolen property is recovered from time to time and if you have not reported your crime, any property related to it will never show up as stolen.

Abandoned vehicles

Recently, a blue Seat Altea car had been apparently abandoned on Redhearn Green outside the Church. It had a flat tyre and enquiries revealed that the car was untaxed and had held no MOT certificate since 2017. Under those circumstances it could and was reported to Waverley Borough Council for action and possible removal. Immediate action was taken, a notice was affixed to the car within 48 hours and the car was removed within a week. My thanks to Waverley Borough Council for such prompt action. Please be aware, however, that action can only be taken in this way, should a vehicle be untaxed.
