It is our intention to have some grass protection installed on areas of Redhearn Green to assist with parking on the grass. We have found what we believe to be an excellent solution which is a green mesh through which the grass will grow. We have seen the system installed in the National Trust car park at Polesden Lacey and we were very impressed. It may be difficult to believe, but there is a hint of spring in the air at times, so we are hopeful that the installation will take place soon, as it is imperative that it is installed during the grass growing season.

The new bench purchased with monies from the Planning Infrastructure Contribution from Waverley Borough Council has now been installed on the recreation ground and is a welcome addition.

The Churt Annual Assembly will take place in the village hall on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at 7.30pm. This is the occasion when we invite all village organisations to update us on their activities during the preceding 12 months.
