I can assure you that all the defects have been reported to Surrey County Council who inform us that the worst of the reported defects will be repaired around 20th April. Let us hope that by the time you read this newsletter the repairs have/ are taking place.

The weather is slowly improving and the weather people tell us that we can expect much warmer weather - maybe just for a short period of time, but during that time it could be warmer here than in Greece! Our contractors have already begun looking after and cutting our grassed areas. A meeting has taken place and it has now been decided which parts of Redhearn Green will have grass protection installed. Work will commence very soon.

Please be aware that Tilford Bridge will soon be closed for major repairs which will have an obvious knock on effect to surrounding roads. You may also be aware that Dye House Road at Thursley is currently closed due to a landslip. It is hoped that it will soon be cleared and reopened.
